Naomi was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and experiences balance issues that often make walking or riding a bike challenging. But that doesn't stop her from doing what she loves.

Thanks to a grant from UHCCF, the family was able to purchase an adaptive tricycle that allows Naomi to independently hit the biking trails and accomplish her goals. Naomi shared she recently "biked 30 miles in one day. I was tired, but I got it done."

Naomi and her family were guests of honor at the 2023 Century Ride, where she biked with UHCCF cyclists to the first stop on the route.

## A remarkable year

The UnitedHealthcare Children's Foundation (UHCCF) had a remarkable year in 2023 as our donors, sponsors, volunteers and UnitedHealth Group employees showed incredible compassion and commitment to our mission to help kids and change lives.

As a result of this extraordinary support, UHCCF gave more than \$6.1 million to families across the country to help them with their child's medical expenses. This is the most the foundation has ever awarded in one year, and we couldn't have done it without you! Since 2005, UHCCF has now provided more than 34,000 grants valued at over \$70 million to children and families across the United States.

As you may know, we host events every year to help raise funds for child medical grants and celebrate our grant recipient families. One of my favorite events is the Minnesota Golf Classic, which welcomed more than 400 golfers to three golf courses throughout the Twin Cities and raised over \$2 million in 2023. The proceeds from this event alone will fund about 1,300 medical grants.

Another great event was our Century Ride, where 130 riders gathered at the Optum headquarters to embark on a 100-mile, 62-mile or e-bike course and raised more than \$875,000 to fund about 500 grants. Finally, the virtual Teddy Bear Run connected UHCCF with nearly 1,200 new donors!

We also made some exciting updates to our National Board of Directors (NBOD). Terry Clark was appointed as the NBOD chair, and we welcomed Dwayne Black, Karen Deutsch, Richard Migliori, M.D., and Jennifer Roberts as new NBOD members. Their dedication to our mission is inspiring, and I have no doubt that we will be able to make an even bigger impact for kids and families with their leadership.

Next year, we will celebrate the silver anniversary of the forming of the foundation. A modest, but brilliant, idea in the Mid-Atlantic has become a material and exciting contributor to our enterprise mission.

When we met with the family to talk about their experience, their mom told us, "We really want to thank you from the bottom of our hearts for doing all that you can to help our children and other children out there in need."

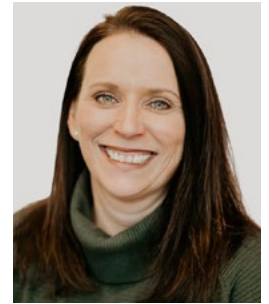


# Helping kids and changing lives across the country

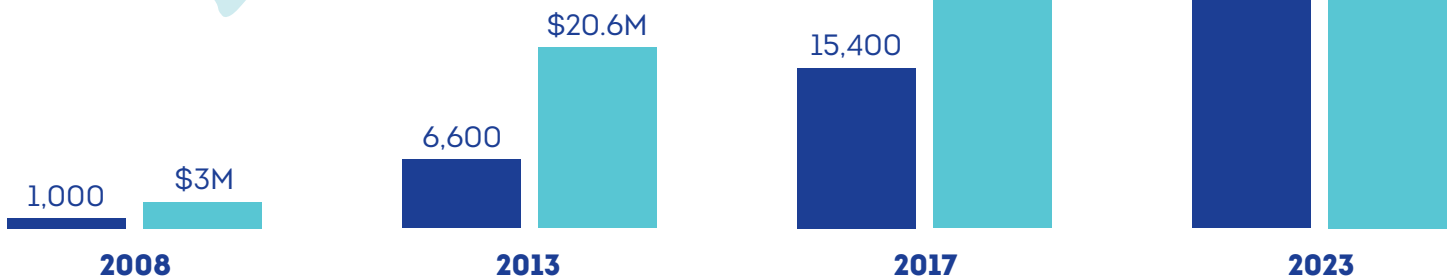
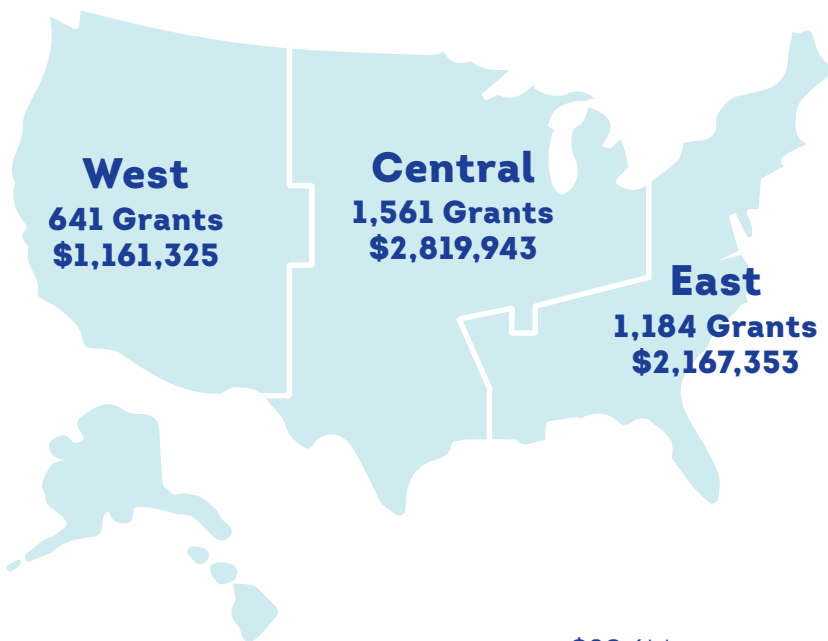

# Stories of hope

## Claire, age 5

**Meet Claire**, a little girl who has kept her family on their toes since the day she was born – a month early on the day after Christmas.

Claire was diagnosed at birth with Trisomy 21, also known as Down syndrome. The diagnosis came as shock to the family, but Down syndrome is only part of Claire's story.

A grant from UHCCF helps cover the speech, occupational and physical therapies that continue to help Claire grow and learn every day.



## Braxton, age 10

**Meet Braxton**, a spirited little boy who enjoys Star Wars battles and building Legos – and connecting with others, especially with his infectious joy.

Braxton was born prematurely at 24 weeks. As he grew, his parents noticed something wasn't right. He was missing major milestones like rolling over, sitting up and crawling. At the age of 2, he was diagnosed with cerebral palsy.

A grant from UHCCF helps support Braxton's growth and development with various intensive therapies that have helped him gain independence as he grows up. It also helped Braxton's family purchase an adaptive tricycle, which his mom says is "definitely more than just a bike. It's an equalizer ... where he can be equivalent to his peers."

## Minnesota Golf Classic

The 14<sup>th</sup> annual Minnesota Golf Classic was a huge success, raising more than \$2.2 million to fund over 1,200 medical grants. In July, 416 golfers came together to support UHCCF and sold out three premier golf courses in the Twin Cities. Six grant families also joined us for the fun-filled day and helped spread the word about just how impactful UHCCF grants are.

### Bridges of Hope

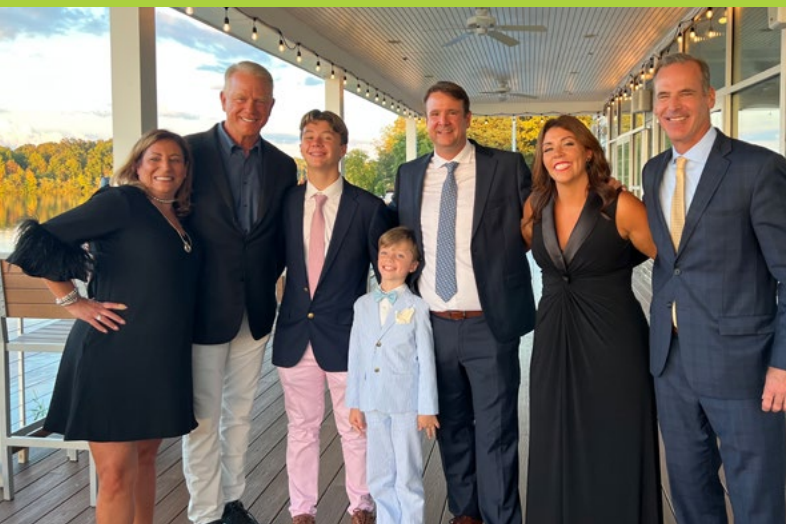


## Bridges of Hope

# Stories of hope

## Liam, age 7

**Meet Liam**, a young boy who loves to swim – especially the backstroke and freestyle – and chat it up with everyone he meets.

As a toddler, Liam kept to himself at activities with other children. But when Liam approached 2 years old, his parents grew increasingly concerned when it became clear he was nonverbal.

A grant from UHCCF has supported Liam's family financially to enable him to attend occupational and speech therapies, which have helped Liam continue developing his fine motor and language skills.

When we met with the family recently, Liam's dad shared, "It really was thanks to the UnitedHealthcare Children's Foundation and the donors and the support we receive that we were able to allow him to continue the services he so desperately needed. They've made a world of difference in his life."

In fact, Liam told us, "I think everything is going great with me now."

## Maci, age 7

**Meet Maci**, a young girl who is determined to accomplish her goals, no matter what.

From a young age, Maci had a few more health complications than her twin brother. But it wasn't until about 16 months old when she was officially diagnosed with cerebral palsy.

A grant from UHCCF helps cover therapy sessions for Maci, so she can continue developing skills to live more independently and gain the confidence to do all her favorite things.

Thanks to the therapy sessions, Maci recently accomplished a huge milestone: taking her first steps! Maci's mom shared, "She wouldn't be where she was if we weren't able to keep progressing with that therapy, and just enjoying life the way she is now."





# Gifts that give back

## Grins<sup>2</sup>

Donating gifts is always twice as nice with our Grins<sup>2</sup> program. Each gift donated to a participating hospital brings a healthy dose of laughter and inspiration to a child, while all proceeds from the purchase help fund a medical grant for a second child. # Programs that change lives



## Cuddles to Go

Throughout 2023, we hosted 35 Cuddles to Go events for teams and individuals. Thanks to everyone who participated in Cuddles to Go activities, we tied more than 900 blankets that provide the gift of comfort for children in hospitals, foster homes and more. And, in addition to the blankets, these fun and unique events raised over \$30,000, which funded 17 medical grants for kids.

## Grins to Go

Throughout 2023, we hosted 16 Grins to Go events for teams and individuals to get their grin on, including at the annual Optum SuperHeroes celebration. With this program, one child receives a great boredom-busting gift bag filled with books, games and puzzles, while another receives a UHCCF medical grant. Thanks to everyone who participated in Grins to Go activities, we assembled more than 1,200 activity bags that went to children in hospitals, foster care centers and support services. These events raised over \$64,000, which funded more than 30 medical grants for kids.



## Host your own events

2023 was an incredible year for employees and supporters to show their creativity while supporting UHCCF. Teams from across the organization, including Optum HouseCalls, UnitedHealthcare provider operations and UHCCF ambassadors, held walks, cookie baking contests and photo contests to raise funds for UHCCF. These events brought virtual teams together across the country and raised more than \$51,000, which funded over 28 medical grants for kids.

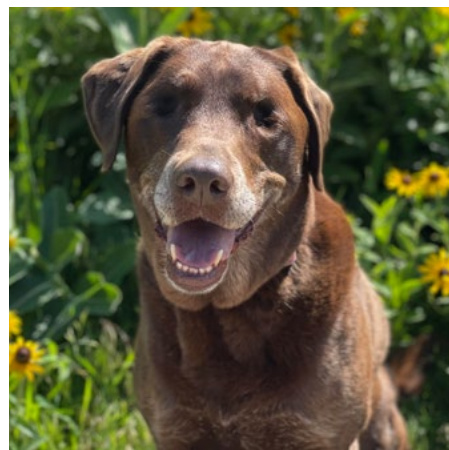




# Virtual events that do good

UHCCF offers medical grants that provide timely financial relief for families who have children with medical needs not covered, or not fully covered, by their commercial health insurance plan. Families do not need to have UnitedHealthcare insurance to be eligible.
